What: The Kentucky Horse Park Foundation is pleased to announce six cross-country schooling days scheduled at the Kentucky Horse Park Cross Country Course for event riders. The course will include basic to advanced obstacles and combinations and will attempt to mimic problems combinations that regularly occur in competition. These schooling days are offered as an educational opportunity and safety will be considered a priority for all riders and horses.

Fee(s):

- \$35/horse/session
- If not stabling, a \$75 seasonal trailer pass or \$20 day trailer pass must be purchased at registration. Seasonal passes may be purchased online at www.kyhorsepark.com.
- Participants requiring the use of a golf cart must purchase a \$50 seasonal or \$25 event golf cart license at registration. Seasonal golf cart licenses may be purchased in advance at www.kyhorsepark.com. (**restrictions apply on use of motorized vehicles on the course**).

Registration:

- Onsite registration is available.
- Riders may also pre-register by downloading a form at www.khpfoundation.org. Completed forms can be emailed to foundation@khpfoundation.org or faxed to 859-254-7121. Fees are due upon arrival and are required before receiving a pinny.
- All riders must sign-in at the registration table prior to mounting or admission to the course. The registration table will be set up at the back entrance of the Kentucky Horse Park Campground on Nina Bonnie Road. All registered riders must be issued a pinny.
- All trainers and coaches must sign in at the registration table where maps will be given out showing placement of obstacles and closed areas.

- Riders may register for one session or both (where applicable).
- Each session will end exactly at the specified time. Riders are expected to exit the course in a timely manner and are expected to be off-course within 10 minutes following completion of session.
- Failure to exit the course when required may result in disciplinary action.
- Pinnys must be checked back into the registration table immediately upon exiting the course.
- All horses must have appropriate veterinary inspections and a negative coggins test per state laws.

Policies / Procedures / Requirements:

- Riders must wear protective helmets as per United States Equestrian Federation headgear requirements and regulations at all times while mounted.
- All riders must wear protective vests as approved for cross country riding at all times while mounted. Medical armbands are required and must be shown at registration table.
- Restrictions apply on the use of motorized vehicles on the cross country course.
- Parking is allowed in designated areas only.
- No riding is allowed in rings, on polo fields, or on the steeplechase track.
- No lunging on the course.
- No vehicles shall be driven or parked within 20 feet of any jump.
- All horses must have a negative coggins test within 12 months and a 30 day (out of state horses) or 150 day (in-state horses) health certificate.

Facilities:

- Courses will be developed on the Kentucky Horse Park Cross Country Course utilizing existing permanent jumps, as well as portable jumps.
- Stabling may not be available for all schoolings. Contact the Kentucky Horse Park at 859-259-4205 to inquire about stabling reservations at least 24 hours in advance of event. Cost of stabling is \$15/day.
- Riding arenas are not available for schooling horses.

Safety:

- The Kentucky Horse Park Foundation will have a warning card system in effect during all schooling days. Stewards will be present monitoring all riding, jumping and general course conduct. The first warning card will be issued as a warning. The second warning card issued will require the participant to dismount and exit the course. The third warning card will prohibit participants from participating in future schooling days.
